

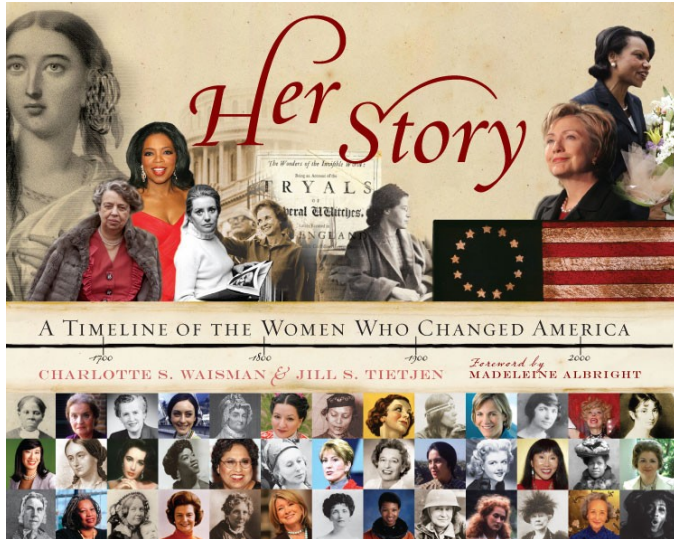
## Venus Features Flash Cards – Set ONE

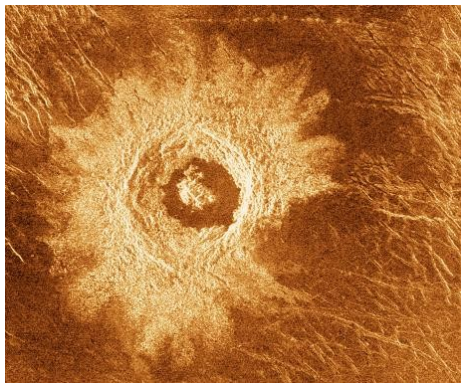
Each flash card is sized for a 4” x 6” index card with a front and back side. The front side contains an image and a question. The back side repeats the question and provides the answer.

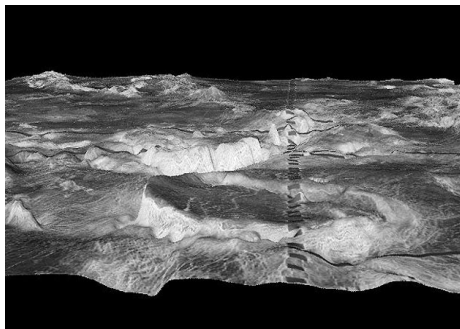
