The weekend will be filled with celebrations honoring the anniversary of the 1848 convention and signing of the Declaration of Sentiments. Those important events, which took place in Seneca Falls 160 years ago, were the first monumental steps on the road to women's suffrage.

The National Women's Hall of Fame will once again host a team from the Genesee Country Village and Museum to give a demonstration of women's vintage baseball. Played in full period dress, the ladies of Priscilla Porter's love to include spectators in the demonstration. The more the merrier.

The weekend will also feature the official unveiling of *Elizabeth Cady Stanton, The Seed of Consciousness*, by acclaimed artist Katherine Pfeffer Pross, as well as the close of bidding on *Elizabeth Cady Stanton, in the Name of Self-Sovereignty* and *Susan B. Anthony, Self-Sacrificed Cause*.

Additional highlights of this year's celebration include a women's march through Seneca Falls, recreating the 1848 march to the Wesleyan Chapel from Elizabeth Cady Stanton's home.

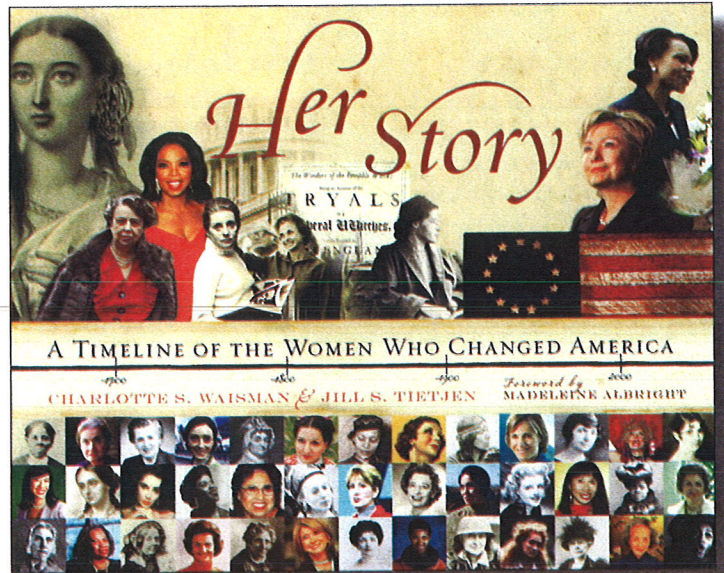
This Year's Must Read

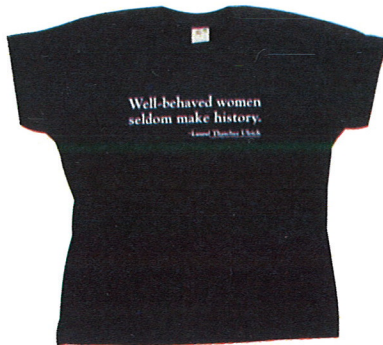

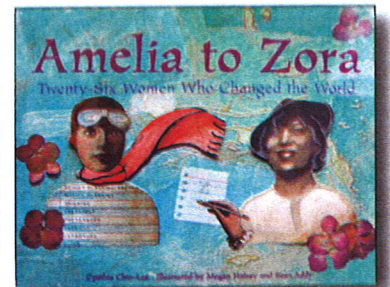
Well Behaved Women Seldom Make History T-Shirts – New!

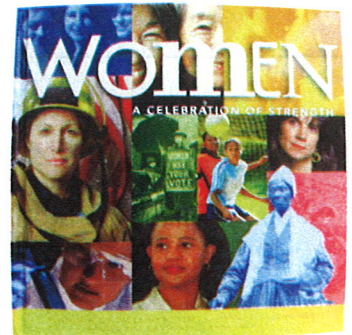


We Can Do It! Temporary Tattoos – New!
